She has a job she enjoys, in which her employer considers her a valuable team member. She has housemates that are a good fit. She enjoys throwing parties, and going to community music events and dances. A normal life for a single, 46 year old woman.

This means Partnerships in Community Living has created a positive multiplier effect through the services they provide. It is not just our daughter who benefits, all who know and depend on her are better as a result of the investment in her capabilities. She is currently taking an interest in learning to read, something we never would have expected.

Thank you for recognizing the gains that have and will continue to be made, for everyone in the State of Oregon, with continued funding levels for Developmental Disabilities Services.

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
