As a resident of the rural Bandon area for more than 40 years I am very interested in seeing our area, including our farmers and fishermen, and all of our children and families thrive. I am writing to ask you to give your full support to HB 2579, to expand the funding for Oregon's Farm to School and School Garden programs. This program has been very successful in helping Oregon's economy, particularly our farmers, and in encouraging healthy eating for children, which can help establish lifelong habits. In addition, gardening has been shown to benefit mental health for both children and adults.

I am retired now, but when I worked as the Education Specialist for a Head Start program, I facilitated a Farm to School project with a mini-grant that we received.
