REAL ID: Background

Federal Real ID Act passed in 2005


- Sets standards for federal acceptance of state driver licenses & ID cards
- Driver licenses & IDs not compliant with Real ID will not be accepted by TSA to board domestic flights, and cannot be used to enter certain federal facilities
- Nationwide enforcement of the Real ID Act will begin <u>October 1,</u> <u>2020</u>

Oregon's Compliance Status

- SB 536 (2009) prevented agencies from spending money to comply
- SB 374 (2017) repealed laws from 2009; directed DMV to comply
- Oregon has an extension
- Beginning <u>July 6, 2020</u>, Oregon will offer Real ID compliant cards




REAL ID: Federal Implementation Components





REAL ID: State Implementation Components






REAL ID: Compliant v. Non-Compliant (Standard) Cards






REAL ID: Timeline




REAL ID: Public Information Plan

REAL ID: Current Compliance




Oregon Real ID Implementation July 2020

Benefits:

- Lessons learned from other states
- More states enrolled in S2S
- Increased public awareness
- Greater accuracy with OLIVR

Challenges:

- OLIVR Driver rollout
- S2S & USPVS interfaces
- Educating the public
- Real ID enforcement 3 months later
