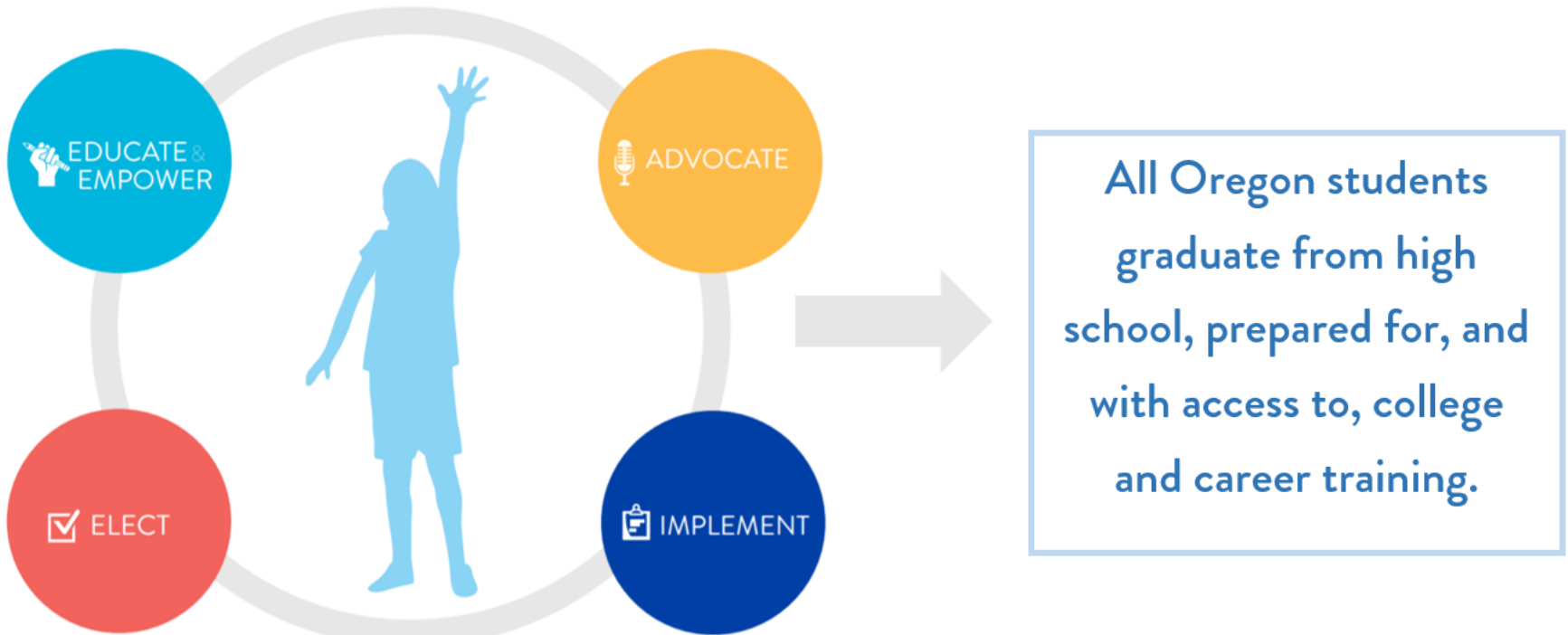

# THREE MAJOR PILLARS OF MEASURE 98



## CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Oregon students who earn **half a credit** of CTE graduate at **86%**; students who earn a **full credit** of CTE graduate at nearly **92%**.



## COLLEGE-LEVEL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Oregon students who participate in accelerated learning are more likely **to graduate from high school (93%), and enroll in college (63%).**



## DROPOUT PREVENTION

Oregon students who are **on track by the end of ninth grade (with six credits)** are **twice more likely to graduate** from high school on time.

# HOUSE BILL 2246 (2017)

HB 2246A made legislative changes to Measure 98 and passed.

- **Flexibility for small- and medium-sized districts:**

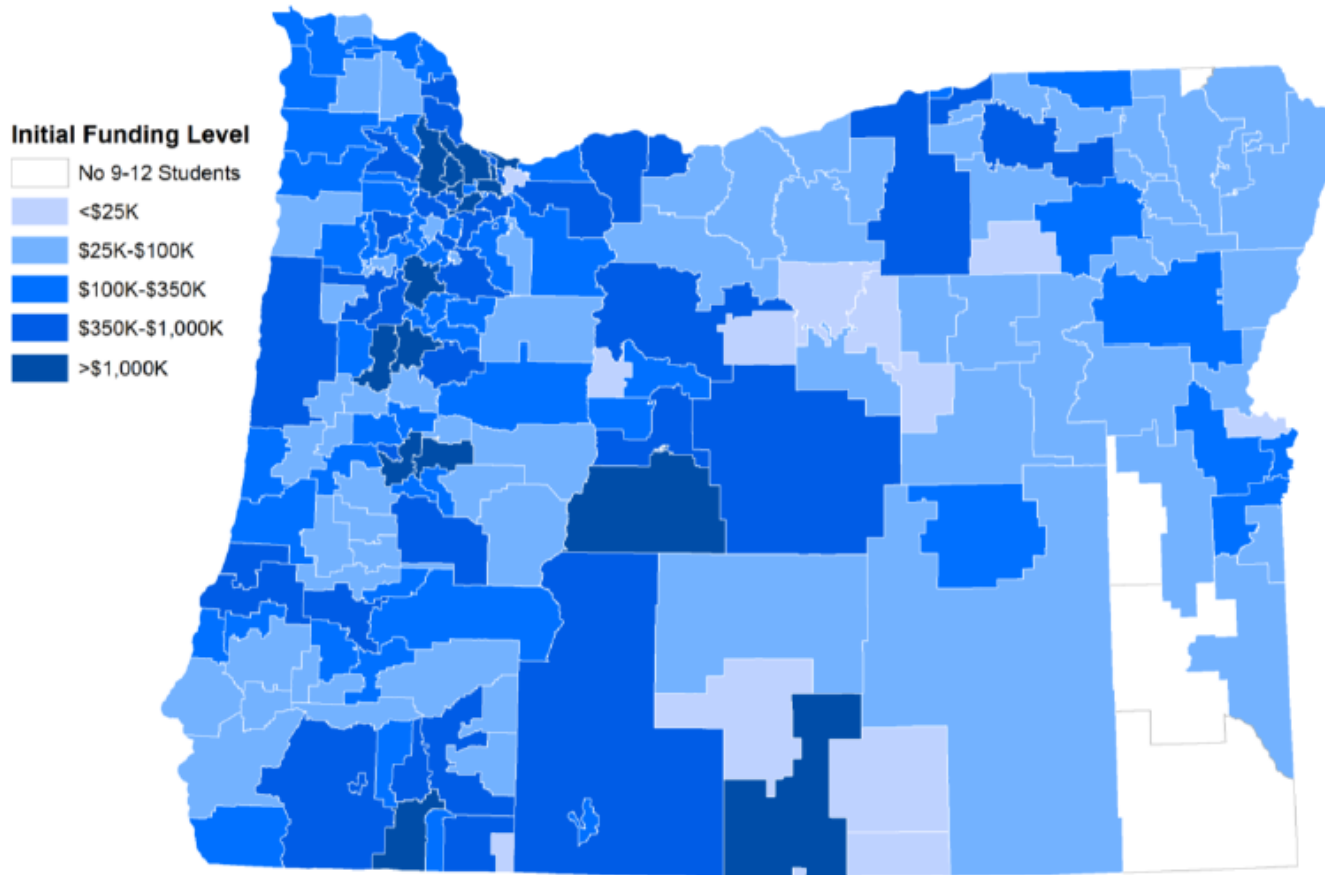
*Small districts (less than \$200k/biennium) can choose to do only one of the three pillars.*

*Medium districts (between \$200k-\$700k/biennium) can choose to do two of the three pillars, but one must be CTE.*

*Large districts (above \$700k/biennium) must implement all three pillars.*

- **Four year plans**
- **Up to 15% can be used in 8th grade, must align with 1+ of the three pillars**
- **\$170 million for the 2017-19 biennium (57% funded)**

# MEASURE 98'S EARLY IMPACT

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## EARLY IMPACT ON STAFF CAPACITY

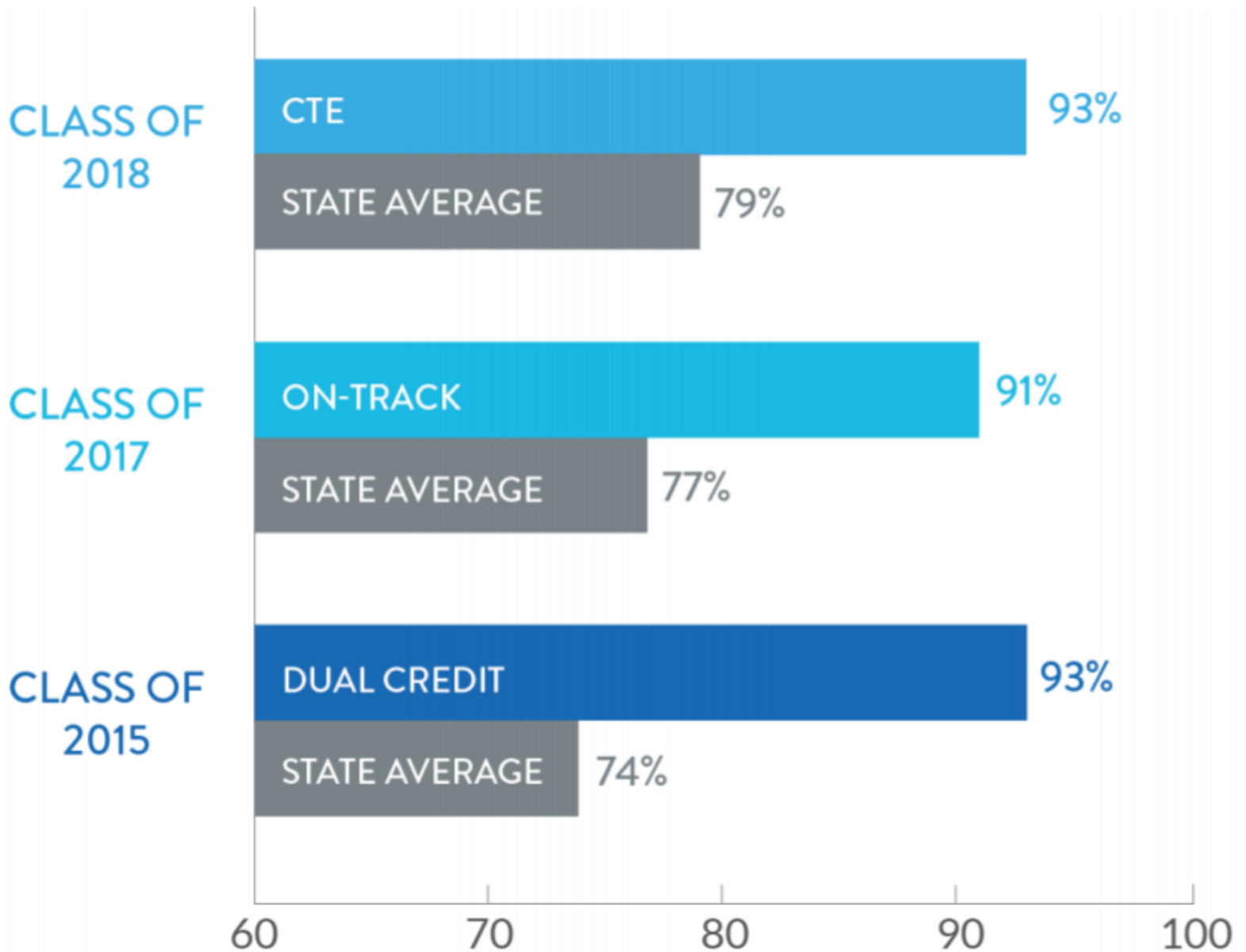
1. Equivalent of 438 full-time jobs created (at minimum, 438 people have jobs as a result)
  2. 831 programs approved in 2017-18 (increase of 82 programs over 2016-17)
  3. 466 CTE teachers applied for licenses (September 2017 - June 2018)

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# OREGON HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES



In its first biennium, Measure 98 achieved incredible change for Oregon students, despite receiving only half of its intended funding. To realize the Measure's promise in its entirety, lawmakers must fully fund it at \$303.2 million for the 2019-2021 biennium.

As our state continues to grapple with the third-worst graduation rate in the country, Measure 98 provides the resources and supports needed to re-write Oregon's narrative around public education.

Your voice is vital as we urge lawmakers to invest in these opportunities for students. The stakes are too high for us to let this moment slip – at a time when the Governor and legislators from the Joint Committee for Student Success have all called for full funding, it's up to every Oregonian to urge their lawmakers to follow through and fully fund Measure 98.

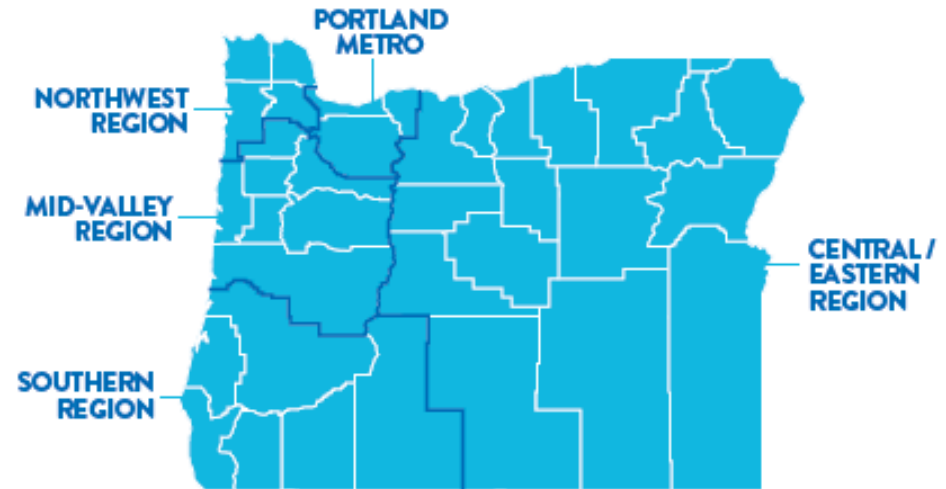


# CENTER FOR HIGH SCHOOL SUCCESS (CHSS)
