The time is right to move forward in Oregon. You, as elected legislators have a responsibility to do what is right for the citizens of this great state. Doing nothing is not an option. The cost of doing nothing far outweighs the costs of moving forward toward a carbon free environment. Do not let perfect be the enemy of the good!
