Health insurance alone continues to go up every year at 15-30%! With this bill, our heating will go up about 11% (estimated). As it stands, my neighbors and myself feel cold in the winter because we can't afford to keep the heat in the 70s, because in order to do that, we'd have to pay \$200-\$300 a month. Also, gasoline prices will rise and we're already in the top 6% in regards to our country's average cost for gasoline.
