I am writing today to express my concerns about the impacts of HB 2020 on my local community. This bill has significant negative impacts on local businesses and families. The Bay Area Chamber of Commerce represents over 500 members who are committed growing business opportunities and providing living-wage jobs for families across the state.

As I, a local citizen that represents small business owners, I am proud of the role these members play in making Oregon a current leader in renewable energy and low carbon emissions. Unfortunately, HB 2020 will only drive up the cost of everyday needs for Oregonians and hurt our ability to grow valuable jobs across the state.

If Oregon passes a cap-and-trade law, it will increase the cost of living and working in Oregon. All residents will bear the cost of fuel increases and increased natural gas rates. The price of fuel would increase by at least 16 cents per gallon and would drive Oregon to have the third-highest gas prices in the country. Natural gas prices would also increase by double digits in the first year. This not only hurts local families but businesses as well.

As drafted, HB 2020 penalizes companies that make or grow things in Oregon. Companies in Oregon would end up paying higher energy and operating costs, which would result in fewer living-wage jobs. This is especially concerning in rural areas.
