I was a teacher in my country and because of various situations in life I was faced with the need to immigrate to this country. I was fortunate to have a legal way of doing so and so I did. Since I arrived in this country it has become very difficult for me to provide child care for my two children. I move to Salem without having the family support system I once had in my home country. I was all alone in a city with not a single family member to support me while I established myself in this country.

Starting with a minimum wage salary that was not enough to cover all my expenses and not having any other additional resources, I was forced to seek other types of aid. Like asking for favors from friends, or neighbors while searching for other jobs that would allow me to have a decent salary to cover our basic needs. As a single mother of two boys all of these hardships have brought me many worries that I have had to solve and deal with by myself day in and day out to get my children ahead in life. While I have done this by myself I know I am not alone in these hardships and this is a struggle many families face.
