The proposed base funding is essential to maintain and improve the capacity of the OISC to carry out its legislative mandates. The infusion of \$200,000 to the Invasive Species Control Account will enable the Council to continue to support high priority invasive species control efforts over the next few years. I would implore to legislature to make a similar appropriation each biennium in perpetuity. These funds are extremely important but they are woefully insufficient to address the myriad of invasive species that are established or will be introduced to our state.
