Dear Oregon Senators and Representatives,

I am writing to you about the proposed bill HB 3063. I am strongly opposed to this bill, and urge you to not allow it out of committee.

I am not anti-vaccine; however, I believe strongly that mandating any medical procedure is unconstitutional. I am concerned with preserving the right to self-determination on many levels, particularly where individual health is concerned.

No medical procedure should ever be forced or coerced when there is risk. Vaccines have many risks both known and unknown. Some of the risks are listed on the vaccine insert. Other risks are just being brought to light and need further research. Adverse reactions are severely under reported and misdiagnosed. Research shows that only about 1% of vaccine adverse reactions are reported to the VAERS adverse reaction database. Overall, vaccine safety monitoring needs dramatic improvement before we can understand and compare the real risks and benefits of vaccines.

Another concern I have is the structure of responsibility for vaccine related injuries. Vaccine makers are indemnified from lawsuits related to the safety of their products. A citizen injured by a vaccine must sue our federal government. When those making a product are not responsible for it's negative outcomes, there is little motivation to ensure the safety and improvement of that product.

The responsibility for vaccine safety oversight and improvement was given to the department of Health and Human Services in a clause if the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986. The HHS has failed in their congressional directive to study vaccine safety for 30 years.

Finally, mandating liability-free vaccines that have not been properly safety tested is in direct opposition to the first tenet of the Nuremberg Code: The voluntary consent of the human subject is absolutely essential.

As the list of "recommended" vaccines grows to include much less dangerous illnesses, our confidence in the need for them decreases, and our questioning the motivation of the State increases. We need to take a look at the vaccine views and practices of other developed countries who have much healthier young populations and much lower rates of infant deaths. We need to take a big step back and seriously look at all the data and science related to vaccine safety. We also need to consider who benefits financially from a mandated vaccine program. In our capitalist country, the medical system is not immune to financial influence.
