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My name is Stacey Groah. I am a mother of two and I live in Salem.

I am asking you to vote NO on HB3063.

Like many of the families here, I was vaccinating my children before they started having adverse reactions to the vaccines. It took a while for us to realize the connection between the vaccines and my son's asthma plus developmental delays and my daughter's severe skin issues.

Once we realized the connection we stopped vaccinating and my daughter's skin has since cleared up. My son unfortunately has to be on medication to keep his asthma controlled and his developmental delays are likely going to affect him his whole life.

Clearly their bodies were not processing the vaccines well. Even though my children had a bad reaction to them, they do not qualify for a medical exemption from the state.
