The Oregon Education Association (OEA) represents more than 44,000 educators who serve more than 600,000 Oregon students. Our members include educators, specialists, support staff, custodians, bus drivers, and community college faculty and staff from across the state. OEA would like to express our support for HB 2440 and encourage the committee to support this legislation.

Educators work hard to help students reach their full potential, and OEA strongly believes in access to education for all Oregon students. As a state, Oregon has taken many critical steps forward to help all students succeed. However, every day, educators still support students every day who face disparities and inequitable outcomes that unfold, both inside and outside of the classroom. Oregon's Latino/a population faces many of these barriers, and is increasing more rapidly than any other community in Oregon.
