Dear committee members,

I urge you to vote to move this bill forward to the floor.

As a physician, I am very well aware of the cost of climate change on my patients, as demonstrated quite forcefully the past two years as wildfires raged across the West and in Oregon and Washington in particular. We saw so many of our patients with lung and heart disease, both very young and very old, suffer with all the smoke in the air.

Predictably, these effects will fall first on those with the fewest resources, the least access to healthcare, and the most vulnerable to the effects.

We need to reduce carbon in the atmosphere in order to slow or reverse the changes that nearly all climate scientists around the world agree are happening at an ever accelerating pace.
