

Thank you Chair Salinas, Co-Chairs and other Representatives on the Health Care Committee. I too spent 3+ hours in Hearing room E yesterday, but was one of the 175 who was unable to be called forth to give testimony. I left as soon as I finished teaching my classes in Beaverton, so I will share my testimony online. It is simple, but powerful as we are a family this bill was drafted to protect- a family with immuno-compromised members.

I, Jessica Deltac, a resident of Multnomah county have a Husband who is **battling cancer** - AITL a rare form of Lymphoma. He is immunity compromised due to his medical procedures including an unsuccessful auto stem cell transplant, and soon to be a successful allo stem cell transplant. We do not support the bill due to the fact that we believe it is discriminatory and unconstitutional. There are a multitude of diseases, infections and reactions my husband can have that do not have an immunization. Any immuno-compromised child or adult must make concessions to ensure a safe lifestyle. At least one of the measles cases in Vancouver was not from a Wild Russian strain, but a strain occurring from a Measles Vaccine. MMR does shed in the 13 days after inoculation.

We are an **immuno-compromised family** and OPPOSE HB3063.
