

I am writing this letter to you today as a very concerned mother of two boys ages 8 and 6. I am aware of the medical hearings that are happening to remove personal exemptions and mandate vaccines for all and I am appalled. My boys have both had all of their vaccines and I am not in the anti-vac camp. However, as their parent, I am the only one who has the right to say what can and can not be put into their bodies. Seeing that over \$4 billion has been paid out for vaccine injuries and deaths and HHS estimates less than 1% of adverse events are reported, it is clear that mandating any procedure involving such risks is completely unethical. Mandating liability-free vaccines that have not been properly safety tested is in direct opposition to the first tenet of the Nuremberg Code: The voluntary consent of the human subject is absolutely essential. I stand united with thousands of others who demand our freedom be protected. I demand that hearings be fair, balanced, and include opposing viewpoints. There are many highly qualified individuals to present those viewpoints and both sides have the right to be heard. Furthermore, issues related to vaccines should be governed by the states. There is no need to give away the states rights to the federal government.

I also have signed the petition in support of a presidential appointment of an independent vaccine safety commission. HHS has failed in its Congressional directive to study vaccine safety for 30 years. Appointing a independent vaccine safety commission is not only necessary, it is the most humane thing we can do to protect the future of our nation and the world.
