EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Transition to Kindergarten; Designed to help incoming kindergarten children and their families learn skills to be successful in school, to include; Jump Start, Little Chippers to School Success and Me & My Playgroup.
After School Programs; Fun hands-on, literacy based after school classes that uses proven strategies to foster literacy skills, science, math, art, and critical thinking for 5 - 6 year olds.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Girls Circle: Designed to teach girls the value and power of being themselves.

Boys Council: A strengths-based group approach to promote boys' & young men's safe and healthy development.
