I am a retired 69 year old mother, grandmother and resident of southern Oregon.

I have examined the vaccine issue thoroughly over the last 15 years and am quite familiar with the research and arguments regarding their safety and efficacy. As such, I have not been an advocate of the government's recommended immunization schedule and I most certainly do not agree with the revocation of personal and religious exceptions.
