RE: Support of HB2449

Chair Evans and Members of the Committee on Veterans and Emergency Preparedness,

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Columbia 9-1-1 Communications District and the law enforcement, fire and EMS agencies we serve in Columbia County, we strongly endorse and respectfully request your assistance with the passage of HB2449.

As you may be aware, the current 9-1-1 tax imposed on all landline and wireless communication devices has not seen any change in its taxable rate of .75/month in nearly 25 years. You may not be aware of the impact this has had on all Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP = 9-1-1 Center) over this nearly one quarter of a century.

Columbia 9-1-1 Communications District is not unusual in that the current monies received via the State of Oregon and the 9-1-1 tax covers only 20% of our overall costs of doing business.

When one compares the economics of costs and services from 1995 (the date of the last adjustment to the 9-1-1 tax) to 2019 it is hard to reconcile how the average citizen of the State of Oregon would expect any household or business to operate without any increase in revenue. A few examples for your review:

- Average cost of a new home:

1995 - \$158,700.00

2018 – \$326,800.00 (Census.gov)

- Medium Household Income:

1995 - \$34,076.00

2018 – \$62,262.00 (Census.gov)

- 1-gallon regular unleaded gas:

1995 - \$1.15

2018 – \$2.62 (bls.gov)

Columbia 9-1-1 Communications District is requesting your support of HB2449 to increase the 9-1-1 tax to \$1.50 and extend the sunset of the tax. We would respectfully ask for your consideration to remove the following provisions from HB2449:

- The provision that provides 2% to counties with a population less than 40,000.
- Reduce the amount for Oregon Emergency Management 9-1-1 Program from 4% to 2%.
- Reduce the amount for the Department of Revenue from 1% to .05%.

It is our sincere hope we can depend on you to consider adding language that would specifically allow interest earned on the 9-1-1 tax to be held in an account to be used for future system upgrades. With the addition of this language, we can begin the savings which are needed to fund our future 9-1-1 needs as it related to technology, infrastructure buildout and security.

HB2449 will help us ensure the communities we serve that they can continue to depend on their 9-1-1 service. We request your immediate assistance as we believe this tax would help support us in continuing the critical and vital service we provide to our communities at the highest possible levels.
