

Dear Health Committee,

It is very important that any amendments to HB3063 include the following:

*Allow a medical exemption that includes all adverse reactions to a vaccine, including any after-market events, **as stated in each vaccine insert**. Family members, especially siblings, must be allowed a medical exemption as well, so they remain uninjured.*

Remove the “emergency” from HB3063 so that the people have a chance to vote on it if it does pass.

Any recommended vaccine catch-up schedules must be per the CDC: <https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/hcp/imz/catchup.html>

Grandfather in all students currently attending high school. Let their vaccine status and exemptions stand until June 2021.

Children with IEPs and 504 plans be allowed to follow a different vaccine schedule, per their doctor’s recommendations.

Include the current exemption process; viewing the online module and/or talking to your doctor to get an exemption after a vaccine injury (as stated in the vaccine inserts). This allows for true informed consent between doctor and patient.
