I am writing as a concerned mother regarding HB 3063. I do not believe this bill would be in the best interests of all the children in our state. Vaccination rates are already quite high, high enough to support the "herd" immunity that is desired by medical professionals. This bill would not allow delayed vaccination or opting out of a required vaccination and this troubles me as many parents choose the aforementioned actions when it comes to vaccines and this would take that right away.

As sponsors of this bill, if you look into the research regarding the required vaccines for school attendance, there is much evidence that all is not as it seems. I am a scientist by training and vocation and thus, have been reading the source materials regarding the different vaccines required and I am appalled at the lack of transparency and conflict of interest in regards to vaccine safety. I see that there is much injury and death that is related to vaccines and this makes me very concerned.
