Dear Representatives and Health Care Committee Members,

We oppose HB 3063.

My family and I live here in Oregon and we believe any bill that would attempt to limit health choice or vaccine choice is unconstitutional. To require someone to take a vaccine or to limit their option to refuse one to attend school is an attempt to displace body autonomy and health freedom.

My wife has had terrible reactions to them and have lifelong consequences because of them. They simply do not work for everyone. To assume that they do and to attempt to mandate them for children to attend school is incredibly irresponsible.
