Growing up in Oregon I, as an adult, am familiar with guns, I was raised around guns. My boys have been a little more sheltered, which is why we chose to participate in the Kid S.A.F.E 'Kids Firearm Safety 1' class this last Fall at our local Cabelas. It was a wonderfully informative class that held the kids' attention while conveying life saving ideas. It gives them the tools to deal with the presence of guns, whether an adult is present, or more importantly when there is not an adult present. It took some of the intrigue away from the machinery, it gave them step by step directions on the actions they would need to take when confronted with a gun.

I had friends who have said to me, "Well we don't own guns, or we don't "believe" in guns, so we wouldn't send our kids to a class like that." I said in response "That is EXACTLY WHY all kids NEED this instruction!" Whether you "believe" in guns or not they exist, whether you like guns or not they are out in the world, if you are afraid of guns you are leaving your kids the most vulnerable because they lack one important thing KNOWLEDGE. The old saying 'Knowledge is power" is absolutely true, this foundation takes a hands on practical approach with the kids, in terms that they understand, how to deal with the situation of finding a gun or being around one.
