## RE: HB 3338 - written testimony

I am writing today to express my opposition to HB3338. I have two teenage daughters, and I recently toured the Portland State University campus for serious consideration for my girls to attend. I have heard a number of amazing things about the education programs offered at PSU, and I have no doubt that is the case. However; during my tour of the, although beautiful, blatantly urban campus, it became immediately obvious my daughters' safety would be a serious consideration.

You do not need to go far to see the large number of homelessness that permeates the campus, the close proximity to non-campus property with bars and clubs, and the porous to non-existent line between on and off campus.

These facts alone would not make me remove PSU from consideration; however, they do encourage me to do some more digging. What I found reassured me greatly. PSU, like most public universities, has sworn police officers. I was surprised to learn that addition was recent, because the need is so blaringly obvious.
