After a serious automobile accident the first 60 minutes, know as the "golden hour," are the most crucial for survival. Often, victims are not able to communicate or advocate for their needs.

The Yellow Dot program can speak when they cannot. A Yellow Dot decal in the back window of a vehicle (or on a motorcyle), alerts first responders to check the glove box for a pamphlet containing vital, up-to-date medical information of the driver or frequent passengers.

Getting vital medical information into the hands of first responders can and will make all the difference in survival in many instances. This is a simple, yet effective way to save lives. A yellow dot decal in the back window and a pamphlet in the glove box is all it takes. Little to no financial impact to the State of Oregon.
