Chair Prozanski, Vice Chair Thatcher, and Members of the Committee on Senate Judiciary,

My name is Jennifer. I'm a resident of Oregon and a sexual assault survivor. I care deeply about the support of sexual assault survivors.

I think SB482 is so important because:

> Having sexual assault survivors go back to court to renew their restraining orders annually is traumatic. This restraining order needs to be extended.

> Protecting vulnerable people, children, survivors of repeat sexual assault offenders, survivors of sexual assault by family is important and their protection deserves to be permanent.

I think the proposed updates are an improvement on the existing Sexual Assault Protection Order because:

> It prevents the responsibility of keeping themselves safe fall on the sexual assault survivors.

> It protects the most vulnerable in the community, especially those who have jobs that do not allow them to take days off to go to court.

My position on this Bill is that I support it and I would like it to get passed. I support <u>SB 482</u> along with it's "-1" amendment.
