I am a resident of Portland, Oregon, and I am a member of the Board of Directors of Clackamas Women's Services ("CWS"), a nonprofit organization that provides many services to support individuals and families who are survivors of domestic violence. One of the services CWS provides is a ten-week curriculum offered in over 20 middle and high schools in Clackamas County. This program teaches students about healthy relationships and addresses the root causes of gender-based violence.

Without a dedicated source of funding, services provided by CWS are caught in the bind of constantly having to respond to crises without having sufficient resources to do more to prevent sexual and domestic violence before it occurs.
