

HB 2923 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes resident status for purpose of purchasing licenses, tags, or permits issued by Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission for persons who pay out-of-state tuition at an Oregon institution of higher education within 12 months prior to purchase of license, tag, or permit; or to persons who present an Oregon tax return submitted within 12 months prior to purchasing a license, tag, or permit.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife offers hunting licenses, tags, and permits to both Oregon residents and nonresidents. The price of resident hunting licenses, tags, and permits is typically less than the equivalent licenses, tags, and permits for a nonresident. For example, in 2019, the cost of a resident annual hunting license is \$33.50, while a nonresident annual hunting license costs \$167. Currently, residency related to wildlife licenses, tags, and permits requires that a person reside in the state for at least six consecutive months prior to the date of application.

House Bill 2923 would establish certain persons as resident for purpose of purchasing licenses, tags, or permits issued by the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission.
