I think that we should elect the President using a National Popular Vote and that the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact is the best way to do that.

The President Should be Elected by All Americans, Not Just Those in Swing States

The National Popular Vote bill would guarantee the Presidency to the candidate who receives the most popular votes in all 50 states and D.C. This ensures that *every* vote, in *every* state, will matter in *every* presidential election.
