# HB 2181 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires State Workforce and Talent Development Board to conduct study and analyze how to implement recommendations of the Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development, and to report to the Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2020. Repeals requirements on January 2, 2021.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-1 Replaces measure. Establishes Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development (Task Force) to continue the work of predecessor task force and study and develop a description of the scope and extent of the maritime sector and maritime sector workforce in Oregon and develop recommendations for State Workforce and Talent Development Board (WTDB) to address the maritime sector in a unified plan for the statewide workforce development system. Specifies membership and directs the Association of Oregon Counties to provide staff support. Requires Task Force to submit report to Legislative Assembly and WTDB by September 15, 2020. Requires WTDB to conduct a study and analyze how to implement recommendations of Task Force and predecessor task force, and to report to the Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2020 and September 15, 2022. Sunsets Task Force on December 31, 2020 and WTDB study on December 31, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

According to the Oregon Employment Department, Oregon's maritime sector workforce totaled nearly 19,000 in 2017. This number includes civilian maritime workers, such as those working in Oregon businesses; commercial fishers in Oregon waters; commercial fishers who live in Oregon and fish in Alaska, California, or Washington; active mariners with a U.S. Coast Guard officer endorsement or rating who use an Oregon mailing address; and military service members in U.S. Coast Guard and Navy. Thirty-three of Oregon's 36 counties have maritime sector jobs.

The Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development was created in 2017 to study and develop a description of maritime sector and maritime sector workforce in Oregon and to develop recommendations for the State Workforce and Talent Development Board to incorporate consideration of the maritime sector into the statewide workforce investment system plan.

The State Workforce and Talent Development Board convenes system agencies and stakeholders, provides oversight to the workforce development system, and promotes the alignment and integration of services and resources to provide effective solutions to businesses and individuals for their workforce needs. The Board must develop and update a unified state Workforce and Talent Development Plan every biennium and submit a report on the plan to the Governor and the legislature every year.

House Bill 2181 requires State Workforce and Talent Development Board to conduct study and analyze how to implement recommendations of the Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development, and to report to the Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2020.
