The FERNS notification system needs to be revised. A one-year window when neighboring timberland *might* be sprayed is too vague, especially when one's own pets and garden crops might be exposed to drift.

State foresters will not have to be deployed to block entrance to areas about to be sprayed, therefore saving money for the state of Oregon.
