To Hon. Senate Rules Committee Oregon State Legislature

In addition to the many arguments for Oregon to adopt the National Public Vote Bill, it seems such a law would limit if not make impossible effective interference in the results of presidential elections by domestic and foreign operatives.

For instance, it has been reported electoral votes were obtained in the 2016 presidential election by the use of Internet based advertising targeting susceptible voters in four or so states. It seems strongly arguable such a program of electoral influence would be very difficult if not impossible to implement on the national basis required if the National Public Vote Bill is in effect in enough states to produce 270 electoral votes.
