SB 926 (<u>https://olis.leg.state.or.us/liz/2019R1/Measures/Overview/SB926</u>) will prohibit aerial spraying in state forests (it's already banned on federal forests) and SB 931 (<u>https://olis.leg.state.or.us/liz/2019R1/Measures/Overview/SB931</u> will require the timber companies to inform people who sign up on the FERNS system of more accurate dates of spraying, if the spray has to be rescheduled, and requires notification of specific pesticides being used in the spray. This would enable people to assure that they can avoid spray areas and keep animals protected.
