## Comments on SB 978

Hello, my name is Jerry Ramsey, I live in Newberg and have been a resident of Oregon since December of 1963. I served 6 years in the Marines and received an Honorable Discharge in 1973. I am presently rated 80% disabled by the Veterans Administration. When I was inducted into the Marines, I swore an Oath in which I said, in part, "I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and DOMESTIC". Some have asked, does our military oath expire? Capt. Seid Waddell says, our OATH never expires. It is our duty to allways defend the Constitution against all enemies, foreign and DOMESTIC. Now I had a chance in Vietnam to defend the Constitution against some foreign enemies and Uncle Sam provided the tools for me (an M-16 aka AR-15). I'm too old to go and fight any foreign enemies but I could still fight some DOMESTIC enemies. free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, SHALL NOT BE INFRINGED.
