I want to thank you for this opportunity to speak on behalf of the Hundreds of Businesses and thousands of individual members that I represent here today!

I am Rick Skinner, an Oregon Resident, and life time resident of the Coos Bay/North Bend Area.

I am the **Co-Chair of Boost Southern Oregon**. **Chair of SCDC** (South Coast Development Council). **Past President** of the Bay Area Chamber of Commerce and currently **Vice President, in charge of Government Affairs and Economic Development**. I am also, the **Vice Chair of SWACT** (Southwest Area Commission on Transportation) for Region III.

I am here to ask you to **support Senator Roblan's Proposed amendments** to Senate Bill 927!

Without the amendments, I would be asking each of the committee members to **not support & reject Senate Bill 927!** 

Senator Roblan's amendments include;

- 5) not renumbered".
- 6) On Page 2, line 11, delete "and the repeal of ORS 197.772 by section 1 of
- 7) this."
- 8) In line 12, delete "2019 Act."

In researching this Senate Bill, I have found ORS 197.772, Means, removal of owner consent! The strange thing is, you have to opt out of these nominations, instead of opting in!

It seems some, are **representing Special Interest Groups**, rather than representing the people and property owners!

These **Special Interest Groups** think this (owner consent) imposes a completely one-side system for historic designation that denies the community a voice or local government the option of protecting a local landmark from demolition.

So, repeal ORS 197.772, repealing the property owners right to opt out of a nomination! This isn't right!

Special interest groups say;

"All these buildings have **seismic safety crisis** that must be addressed to avoid economic disaster and loss of life."
