I am writing on behalf of Northwest Youth Corps and our 20,000 alumni to offer our strong support for Senate Bill 772 which will establish a task force to develop and recommend an innovative response to our growing wildfire and smoke problems, while helping train the next generation of forestry and conservation workforce.

Northwest Youth Corps (NYC) is a non-profit organization that provides opportunities for youth and young adults to learn, grow, and experience success, by engaging them in paid conservation service programs throughout the state of Oregon.
