Dear Co-Chair Beyer, Co-Chair Nosse, and Members of the Joint Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to present before the Joint Committee on Ways and Means Subcommittee on Human Services on April 15, 2019, regarding CCO 2.0. Please find below responses to questions raised during that presentation. Please do not hesitate to contact me or my office if you have further questions.

1. Representative Hayden asked, Does Cover All Kids use the same base rate for payment to CCOs as does Oregon Health Plan/Medicaid?

Yes, the Cover All Kids (CAK) program uses the same base rates as the Medicaid children population for the 2018 and 2019 rate cycle. Also, it uses the same rate adjustments as are used for the Medicaid population to account for diagnostic risk adjustments (that is, known differences in health status among different enrollment populations). While the rate paid to the CCOs is the same for CAK and Medicaid, it's important to note that the CAK rate is paid with 100% state funds.

The Medicaid rates were used due to the lack of historic experience with the CAK population specifically. Once historical information is available for the CAK program, OHA and OHA's actuaries will review CAK-specific experience to inform future rate development.

2. Representative Hayden asked, How many distinct entities have submitted applications to provide services under CCO 2.0 (as opposed to how many applications were submitted)?

OHA has 20 letters of intent for CCO 2.0. Those letters were submitted by 15 Risk Assuming Entities – that is, the organizations which own or are otherwise ultimately responsible for the CCOs. Three of those Risk Assuming Entities (CareOregon, Moda, and PacificSource) intend to serve different service areas under different names.

Originally, OHA received 24 letters of intent. Four organizations later withdrew their letter of intent, all from the Portland metro area. However, this area is still covered by Health Share of Oregon, which is a joint effort by four organizations (CareOregon, Tuality, Providence, and Kaiser).

The list of organizations and service areas may change with the final applications, which are due on April 22.
