Re: Support for SB 61

The Oregon Medical Association is in support of Senate Bill 61 as proposed by the Oregon Medical Board.

Senate Bill 61 increases the number of public members on the Oregon Medical Board from two to three and consolidates the qualifications for public membership into one provision of statute.

Public members serve an important role as representatives of the public on the Oregon Medical Board. With the current board composition, public members make up 15% of the board membership. SB 61 increases the number of public members on the Oregon Medical Board to three, bringing the percentage to 21% public members, which aligns the Oregon Medical Board with the other health professional licensing boards.

The Oregon Medical Association supports SB 61.
