Re: Technical Change to HCR 2-A

Chair Burdick, Vice Chair Baertschiger Jr., and Members of the Senate Committee on Rules,

I am now in my 13th year as a coach of the Constitution Team from Lincoln High School in Portland, Oregon. Recently, the Committee took action on HCR 2-A honoring the 150th Anniversary of Lincoln High School. After reading the amended resolution, it noted that the team earned 24 state title wins. This figure seemed high to me. So, I conferred with my colleague Alison Brody – who has coached the team for 20 years – as well as current and former staff of the Classroom Law Project which runs the statewide "We the People" program to review past results.

All parties agreed with the data provided below which shows that Lincoln High School teams have won a total of 20 state titles, not 24 as HCR 2-A currently states.

While this may seem like a minor change, both Alison and I believe that the record should be corrected for two reasons:

- 1. Our neighboring team of Grant High School in NE Portland earned 12 state championship titles during the 32 years of the program. A resolution affirming Lincoln High School's wins above what Lincoln H.S. students earned diminishes the wins that Grant H.S. students worked hard to earn.
- 2. The Classroom Law Project has worked incredibly hard to expand, sustain, and rebuild this program in high schools throughout the state in rural and urban areas. We believe that an inaccurate reflection of wins in the record would continue a viewpoint of urban schools becoming more dominant in the competition and hinder efforts to grow statewide.
