**RE:** Equal Treatment Under House Bill 3427 – Agricultural Organizations Delete Exemption of Corporations Described in Section 521 and Section 1381 of the Internal Revenue Code.

We have reviewed the HB3427-17s and are very concerned about the impact on Oregon family owned agricultural companies who compete with corporations described in Section 521 and Section 1381 of the IRS tax code.

For many years, federal and state tax and finance laws have been written to subsidize these corporate tax structures, and today's modern "agricultural cooperative" is now very different from the nostalgic notions of the past. For example, CHS is a massive chemical and fuel cooperative (<u>www.chsinc.com</u>) which has over \$30 Billion in revenue, with net income of nearly \$425 million and is a Fortune 100 company.

Additional advantageous treatment under the tax law for corporations, which are simply organized as a cooperative, will have a negative impact on our local family business and our farmers.

We would request that all agricultural organizations be treated the same under the law.

## The -17's appear to have two major issues, both exemptions should be deleted from the bill:

#1. Page 66, lines 17-19: "(PP) Receipts representing business done with or for members of an agricultural cooperative in this state that is a cooperative organization described in section 1381 of the Internal Revenue Code.

#2. Page67, line 29-30 (f) Organizations described in section 521 of the Internal Revenue Code.

We urge you to make the appropriate changes to the final draft of HB 3427. Thank you for your consideration.
