

HB 3261 Rep Gorsek and Rep Piluso Recording Police Interviews of Youth

## **Background:**

• In 2017, the Legislature passed HB 3242. It required law enforcement to record interviews with youth suspected of felony conduct within law enforcement facilities.

## HB 3261 Updates Current Law:

- HB 3261 updates current law to require interviews are recorded:
  ✓ By police officers, school resource officers, and campus security
  - officers;
  - ✓ In connection with any criminal offense, not just potential felonies;
  - In both law enforcement facilities and out in the field if officer already has access to bodycams.
- Does not require new equipment to be purchased nor does it change the current safety procedures and exceptions already in place.
- Workgroup bill between law enforcement and juvenile law experts.
- Recording youth interviews is a best practice that protects hardworking law enforcement and youth, and it ensures just outcomes and efficiency in the courtroom.

Passed out of House with Broad Bi-Partisan Support
