21% of Oregon's children 5 and under have access to regulated child care <sup>a</sup>



All but 3 counties are child care deserts for children 5 and under <sup>a</sup>

# Child care is expensive, yet wages are low

Median annual price of toddler care in a center is \$14,160<sup>b</sup> Median annual center teacher wages range between \$24,000 - \$34,000

 $\frac{1}{4}$  of the 2016 Oregon workforce left the field by 2017.  $\subseteq$ 

## Workforce <sup>C</sup>

Size – 24,000 Individuals 76% work in centers 14% in large home-based 10% in small home-based **Demographics** Centers Average age of 37 Mothers themselves 94% female More racial/ethnically diverse than Oregon adults <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of center staff have some college or higher



Small home providers are least likely to have a degree & are most likely to speak a language other than English

Oregon families fund 72% of annual child care expenditures<sup>b</sup>

Families Paid \$919,509,590 Federal Paid \$248,551,703

> State Paid \$119,771,366
