I am a middle school teacher working in Bend. I've been teaching in Oregon since 2002, and am a Tier 2 PERS member. Before teaching in Bend, I taught in Northern California and on the Blackfeet Reservation in Montana. Being a teacher is an important and major part of my life - I made a decision while in grad school to pursue teaching after getting my Masters. I did this because I felt an obligation to give back to a world that gave me many advantages. I am passionate about impacting the lives of the kids I work with for 80% of my waking hours. I knew that teaching would not make me financially rich, but I did know that I would have a secure pension/retirement after decades of service.

SB 1049 has the potential to change all of that security for me. My retirement will be my only way of supporting myself after I am done teaching - teachers rarely have the ability to make large investments, and I am no exception. According to PERS analysis, my IAP would be cut 12.5%. This is a tax on my retirement benefits to pay the state's obligation to retirees. This seems unfair and illegal. I am working hard to do an important job, making way less that I could be making in the private sector, and honestly way less than I could be in other states.

I am committed to doing my job caring for and educating my students. I do this job and support my family as best as I can. We need quality teachers in Oregon, and this bill will damage both our ability to recruit more teachers and our ability to retain the ones we have.
