I am opposed to SB 761.

"This bill also eliminates the Secretary of State's authority to issue templates for electronic petition signature sheets until January 2023."

3 ½ years until we can do further e-petition forms? Why?

This legislation carries a very harsh penalty for one person disobeying the rules, no one else is then allowed to print an e-copy of a single petition sheet.

I see only negative results of this bill: Less convenience for people who want to sign petitions and greater risk for those circulating them.

Example: The issue the petition is for may be pertinent to myself and a family member in a care center for physical rehabilitation but someone in a completely different area of the state disobeyed the rule and now I can't print copies for myself and my family member? How is that fair to us? Punish the person who violated the rules, not the whole state!

Example: My daughter is not very tech savvy. Does this mean I can't print a petition for my daughter? My daughter is a registered voter. Why can she not sign a petition that I printed?
