In 2015, legislation established a permanent fund for the grant and provided an initial \$2.5 million of funding as part of a larger lottery bond package. Grant funds are allocated to participating Oregon Main Street Network organizations on behalf of business or property owners to acquire, rehabilitate, or construct buildings that spur economic development. In the 2017 legislative session, an additional \$5 million was approved and will be funded through the sale of the 2019 lottery bond package.
