I am a parent and faculty member at Portland State University, Portland, Oregon. I'm writing to ask you to support HB 2579 and the most recent Amendments, to expand funding for Oregon's farm to school and school garden programs. HB 2579 expands funding for schools to buy Oregon foods and for farm-and garden-based education.

Having worked with many schools for over two decades, I can attest to the significance of this initiative and commend you for your foresight and support for our children, many of whom are vulnerable. Farm to school programs support students, farmers and communities.
