

**HB 3389 B -B11 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY**

**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Provides that the name and address of a prize winner of certain lottery games are confidential and may not be publicly disclosed by the Oregon State Lottery or the Commission unless the prize winner provides a written authorization for such disclosure. Provides that the Oregon State Lottery may pay a prize to the trustee of a trust at the written request of the prize winner. Authorizes the Lottery Commission to establish a service fee that may be charged for lottery tickets or shares. Puts a limit on such fee. Prohibits the Commission from initiating or operating a game for which tickets or shares may be purchased via the Internet or a personal electronic device.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-B11 Removes certain confidentiality provisions in lottery games. Specifies conditions under which the Lottery Commission may offer a sports betting game.

**BACKGROUND:**

House Bill 3389-B prohibits the Lottery from publicly disclosing a winner's name and address unless the winner provides a written authorization for such disclosure, in relation to lottery games offered in at least 30 states. The measure also allows the trustee of a trust to collect the prize at the written request of the prize winner.

House Bill 3389-B allows the Commission to establish a service fee that may be charged in addition to the retail sales price and any other fees required by law. The Commission may not set the service fee at more than 30 percent of the retail sales price.

House Bill 3389-B prohibits the Commission from initiating or operating a game for which tickets or shares may be purchased via the Internet or various personal electronic devices.
