Dear Chair Burdick and Committee Members:

I am a farmers market manager and dietitian in Portland, Oregon. I strongly oppose SB 1050.

SB 1050 was recently introduced and was just scheduled for a hearing, providing virtually no notice or opportunity for the Oregonians who overwhelmingly passed Measure 49 to weigh in. Other bills, from all perspectives, introduced in this and past sessions have attempted to change Measure 49, and the legislature has been adamant that no changes would be made. Passing a major change in the waning hours of this legislative session calls into question that appropriate resolve.

SB 1050 would remove Measure 49's 10-year limitation on subsequent purchasers subdividing or partitioning property or establishing a dwelling authorized by a Ballot Measure 49 final order.

This bill undermines the compact that voters supported in Measure 49, by removing a provision that has been working for over a decade. Measure 49, including this key provision, was passed to recognize expectations of existing property owners, and provide certainty for farmers and others that there would be a finite number of dwellings and time during which any additional

dwellings on resource lands would be built. HB 1050 would undo that. As a dietitian and market manager, I deeply believe that we need to continue to protect lands that serve to grow food in our state and keep that system expanding in order to provide the food security, economic stability of farming, farmers markets and farmer's families. We need to protect our right to grow our local food system, for the benefit of producers and consumers.

I would like to urge this Committee to decline to pass SB 1050 on. Thank you for consideration of my comments.
