Higher education continues to be costly for Oregon students, often becoming a barrier to completion which can hurt a student's ability to compete in the workforce. This is why a tax deduction for higher education expenses makes sense. The Oregon Student Association encourages the Oregon Senate to vote YES on SB 212, which would allow students to get a refund on college expenses. In the past, Oregon students or their families were able to subtract up to \$4,000 dollars in college tuition on their tax returns both state and Federal. This amount of money has relieved many low-income families from the burden of high cost tuition, housing, textbooks etc. Unfortunately, at the federal level this deduction has been discontinued, which means it is up to the Oregon Legislature to ensure continued access to this common-sense tax provision.
