

Vote YES on the Student Success Act (HB 3427)

Vote <u>YES</u> on the Student Success Act (HB 3427) to invest a historic \$2 billion in early childhood and K-12 education — this monumental investment also includes full funding for Measure 98 for a total of \$303.2 million over the next biennium.

Despite receiving only half of its intended funding in 2017, Oregon school districts utilized Measure 98 dollars to hire additional staff, increase support services for students and expand programs. In the first school year alone, 438 full-time jobs were created, and 831 careertechnical education programs were approved and rolled out in classrooms across the state.

Voting <u>YES</u> on the Student Success Act (HB 3427) delivers the full promise of Measure 98 and other important early childhood and K-12 education investments.

More dollars for career-technical education (CTE), accelerated learning, and dropout prevention will make a difference:

- Oregon students who earn half a credit of CTE graduate at 86%; students who earn a full credit of CTE graduate at nearly 92%.
- Oregon students who participate in accelerated learning are more likely to graduate from high school (93%), and enroll in college (63%).
- Oregon students who are **on track by the end of ninth grade (with six credits) are twice more likely to graduate** from high school on time (91% graduation rate versus 40% graduation rate).

Vote <u>YES</u> on the Student Success Act (HB 3427) to help more Oregon students access highquality early learning, receive an excellent education, and graduate from our public schools college and career ready.

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
