HB 3152 B comes to you with a unanimous YES vote from the Joint Committee on Transportation.

WHY IS HB 3152 B NEEDED?

Today, the two largest Dealer Management System providers maintain approximately 80% of the market share for these services. With this increased control of the market and dealer data, local auto dealers have lost control and their vendor partners have been exposed to exorbitant fees or profit sharing demands...just for trying to comply with the contracted services auto dealers, and Oregon consumers, rely on.

WHAT DOES HB 3152 B DO?

HB 3152 B makes important changes to these practices by returning control of their consumer data back to the local dealer. Going forward, when data is transmitted to a DMS, the Oregon auto dealer will be able to authorize release of the consumer data necessary to execute their daily duties, for example, complete vehicle registration and titling. The bill also prohibits an additional fee for transfer of the data the dealer has provided, and already paid for. Finally, HB 3152 B makes it clear that all entities touching consumer data are required to meet data security standards and that liability for protection of consumer data is still intact under Oregon's data breach laws.
